

# AWS STANDARD SYSTEM TRAINING

AWS Standard System Training is instructor-led and delivered online. It covers Foundation Level, Advanced Level and/or Specialist Level curriculum. It is open to the general public and offered in four languages<sup>1</sup>.

The pricing model below is based on the World Bank's classification system that assigns the world's economies to four income groups - low, lower-middle, upper-middle, and high-income countries. The classifications are updated each year on July 1 and are based on GNI<sup>2</sup> per capita (using the Atlas method exchange rates) of the previous year.<sup>3</sup>
